









European Funds drive positive changes in the Mazovia Region

European funds change the lives of the inhabitants of Mazovia. Hundreds of investments were implemented in all regions, the common goal of which was to improve the quality of life, environmental protection, development of entrepreneurship, provide education, as well as heath care financing. This year we are celebrating 19th year of our presence in the European Union, and the recent years have been the time of rapid development of the voivodeship and involvement of beneficiaries. The financial perspective 2014-2020 allowed to co-finance over 5.7 thousand projects, while the completed investments met the needs of the inhabitants. Local governments, the business, cultural and research institutions and health care facilities, as well as non-governmental organizations benefited from the support. The amount of the EU aid is EUR 2 billion. Under the Regional Operational Program for the Mazovia Region 2014-2020, 1,7 thousand projects are implemented in rural areas (what makes 30.5% of all projects) for the amount of EU financing EUR 491.8 million (what makes 24.8% of the value of all projects).

Renovation of schools in Sulejówek

Thanks to the European Funds, it was possible to carry out thermal modernization of two schools in Sulejówek. Currently students from the Secondary School in Sulejówek and the Primary School No. 3 learn in comfortable conditions. The buildings are warm and safe. EU funds were allocated, among others, to for insulation of external walls, roof and flat roof, insulation of building partitions, replacement of windows and doors. Lighting in schools has changed to energy-saving, and the central heating and hot water installations have been modernized. Installation of photovoltaic panels ensures that buildings use renewable energy sources. Heat, cooling and hot water meters were installed in each school. The facilities also gained new facades.

In Ząbki, near Warsaw, a new seat of the Mazovian Regional Hospital Drewnica was built. Patients with various mental problems are admitted to the hospital. The facility also accepts patients addicted to, for example, alcohol. The hospital focuses on the diagnosis of mental disorders, treatment and monitoring of

patients after leaving the facility. A very important goal is to return patients to everyday professional and social life. This most modern psychiatric hospital in Poland would not have been built without European funds. Patients of the Drewnica hospital feel taken care of, undergo treatment in comfortable conditions, receive psychological support and find the meaning of life. The facility in Ząbki also helps in inclusion and social activation, in the fight against poverty and any discrimination.

Safer roads in the Mazovia Region

Residents of such towns as Ciechanów, Kownaty Żędowe, Gostomin, Młock and Niechodzin use reconstructed roads. European funds helped to change the standard of the district road by replacing the road structure and widening the road lane. Traffic participants also use the newly constructed road shoulders and sidewalks. It was also possible to rebuild exits, new bus bays and pedestrian crossings are in operation. In addition, the bridge in Młock was renovated. The implementation of the project affects the safety of drivers and pedestrians every day. Travel times have been shortened, so cars generate less exhaust fumes. The towns in the district are better connected by transport, which also affects the attractiveness of the region.

Thanks to European funds, residents and tourists visiting the Sierpc region can take advantage of interesting cultural and educational offers. Where? The newly renovated Sierpc Town Hall which after the renovation has become a modern museum, encouraging visitors with the appropriate presentation and lighting of the exhibits. The beneficiary took care of o exhibition lighting, rails for hanging exhibits, modern platforms and showcases for safe

and effective presentation of museum collections. The use of innovative solutions makes the place willingly visited. The museum has been adapted to the needs of people with disabilities. There is an elevator in the building, toilets have been adapted, the entrance to the museum is threshold-free, and a lowered counter top has been installed. What is important, the museum promotes the talents of local artists.

An innovative center - the Diagnostics Research and Development Center was established at the Institute of Mother and Child in Warsaw. European funds helped in the purchase of highly specialized laboratory equipment. The Center conducts complex, comprehensive and unique research. Particular emphasis is placed here on the development of medical genetics in the field of genetically determined diseases, as well as inborn defects of metabolism. The facility also aims to conduct diagnostic screening of newborns. All research conducted at the center is characterized by a very high degree of innovation and uniqueness in the scale of Poland, as well as Europe.

Supporting residents in terms of social integration, professional activation, assistance to people with disabilities, as well as those excluded and at risk of social exclusion are priority activities of the European Union. The Warsaw Social Welfare Center implemented a project on professional activation. Participants took advantage of individual meetings with a career advisor, psychologist and

image specialist. These meetings strengthened people's self-esteem and made them want to change their lives. The next step was training and vocational courses. Participants also had the opportunity to take part in socially useful works, professional activation workshops and workshops being a part of the Activation and Integration Programme. The project helped the participants learn to be resourceful and independent.


Revitalization of historic properties (Kamienica Deskurów)

The expansion and redevelopment of properties in Radom, known as Kamienica Deskurów, was supported by European funds. The implementation of the project consisted of revitalizing the buildings, carrying out a comprehensive renovation and restoring their former appearance. The applicant wanted the social and economic revival of Śródmieście Radom and the Kazimierzowskie Town. In tenements, that are open to residents and tourists. there are zones: education, culture, entrepreneurship and a service zone. Tenement houses after revitalization have changed the city landscape and the prepared offer helps to integrate residents, including those at risk of social exclusion. In addition, these places are open to people with disabilities. Thanks to EU funds, a space





Creative school - development of students' key competences

Pupils from primary schools in Koczargi Stare and Zielonki-Parcela took advantage of classes developing digital, mathematical and biological, and language competences, as well as skills needed in everyday life, such as teamwork and creativity. The investment in young people was possible thanks to the support from the European Union. As part of the project, students took part in thematic workshops, e.g. in robotics, electronics, they deepened their knowledge of English or Russian,

went on trips to the Warsaw Zoo, the Copernicus Science Center, and during the holidays they had scientific day camps. In addition, schools received computer equipment and modern teaching aids. More than 150 students participated in the project.

Environmental protection and all activities related to it are the main objectives of the European Union's policy. In Sochaczew, as part of the "Sochaczew Eko-bus" project, buses that meet ecological standards were purchased. Residents willingly use comfortable public transport. In addition, ticket vending machines and timetable boards were installed. The effects of the implemented project include: amenities for passengers and improvement of the functioning of the public transport system. Transport projects and those related to urban mobility are aimed at encouraging residents to give up the car in favor of the bus, tram, subway or bicycle.





The hospital implemented a project involving the implementation of e-services in the field of health care. The funds granted from the EU helped in the purchase of the needed computer equipment and software. The effect of the project are facilities for patients and hospital employees. In health care, we use online services such as:

- e-registration the service allows to check the available date of the selected medical service and register for a doctor's appointment on a selected date, in a given medical entity;
- e-referral enables full electronic management of the treatment referral process from the moment of issuing the referral to the moment of providing the service;
- e-prescription an electronic document that replaces the traditional paper prescription;
- e-correspondence enables electronic communication between the patient and the facility.

In 2022, the Mazovia Region continued to support hospitals and medical rescue teams whose staff takes care of the health and life of residents on a daily basis. Since the beginning of the pandemic, the financial aid from the European Union to support the health care sector non-competitive projects of the Mazovia Local Government has amounted to almost EUR 100 million. As a result, over 70 hospitals received, among others: ventilators, cardiomonitors, defibrillators, X-ray machines, hospital and intensive care beds, as well as ambulances for transporting patients. Some of the facilities have been equipped with sets for non-contact temperature measurement at the entrance to the buildings. Protection measures, including, for example, masks, goggles, visors, overalls, gloves and disinfectants, were also handed over to the facilities. Due to receipt of European funds support was

also provided to rescuers from 5 ambulance stations and sanitary transport from Warsaw, Ostrołęka,

Support for schools in remote education

Schools benefited from EU assistance in providing conditions for remote education. Support from European funds for this purpose amounted to EUR 8 million. Since the beginning of the pandemic over 270 facilities received the equipment needed to prepare and conduct lessons remotely. European funds were allocated for the purchase of i.a. laptops, tablets, multimedia boards, interactive displays, touch boards, printers and software. Teachers and students living in various areas of the Mazovia region benefited from the effects of the support.

REACT-EU: fighting the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic

In response to the crisis caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, the European Union prepared a joint recovery plan for Europe, the so-called NextGenerationEU. One of its main elements is the REACT-EU mechanism, from which 46 projects in Mazovia have so far received funding, and the support amounted to over EUR 21 million.

European funds from the REACT-EU instrument are invested in Mazovia in two areas:

- Thermal modernization of public utility buildings to increase their energy efficiency, and thus
 contribute to improving the quality of the air we all breathe every day. Buildings of offices,
 schools, kindergartens and cultural institutions are subject to energy modernization. Examples of
 investments include: the Sport and Recreation Center in Warka, the Multimedia Center "Natura" in
 Ostrołęka, or the Municipal and Communal Social Welfare Center in Białobrzegi.
- Digitization of services for residents which is of key importance in ensuring the flow of information. Thanks to European funding it will be possible to further computerize the Mazovian Bródnowski Hospital and the Czerniakowski Hospital in Warsaw. Activities aimed at creating an open data base for local governments were also supported.



New opportunities: European Funds for Mazovia 2021-2027

The inhabitants of Mazovia are faced with completely new opportunities which will be brought by the regional program European Funds for Mazovia 2021-2027 (abbreviated "FEM") with a budget exceeding EUR 2.09 billion from the European Union. The European Commission approved the program on 2nd December 2022 while the official inauguration took place during the 12th Mazovia Development Forum. European funds will be allocated to infrastructural, business, research, social and educational projects and those developing the Mazovian labour market. What areas will be supported?



European funds for more competitive and intelligent Mazovia – EUR 223.8 million

among others: research and development, introducing innovations to the market, cluster development, incubation of enterprises, e-services



European funds for the green development of Mazovia – EUR 390.8 million

among others: adaptation to climate change, energy modernization of buildings, air quality control, renewable energy sources, prevention of natural disasters, flood protection, water and sewage management, waste management, protection of landscape parks



European funds for the development of urban mobility in Mazovia - EUR 245 million

among others: ecological public transport and digital systems for management, transfer nodes, cycling and walking infrastructure



European funds for better connected and accessible Mazovia - EUR 222 million

among others: construction and reconstruction of roads, development of rail transport, provision of buses for needs extra-urban transport



European funds for a higher quality of life in Mazovia – EUR 188.7 million

among others: investments in educational, social, health and cultural infrastructure, as well as in tourism



European funds for professionally active Mazovia – EUR 151.1 million

among others: professional activation of the unemployed, support for employers in introducing tele-work



European funds for modern and accessible education in Mazovia – EUR 196 million

among others: pre-school education, development of students' key competences, vocational education, development services and local initiatives for adult education



European funds for active integration and development of social and health services in Mazovia – EUR 219.6 million

among others: social and professional activation of residents at risk of poverty and social exclusion, health programmes, support for social enterprises, services for children and youth, support for people affected by violence, homeless people, integration of migrants

Effects of information and promotion activities

Conclusions of the Survey on Recognition and Knowledge of European Funds in the Polish Society. Edition 2022

- The vast majority (87%) support Poland's membership in the European Union (6% growth from 2018)
 - According to the vast majority (92%) European funds contribute to the development of Poland
 - Recognition of the keywords European funds and EU funds is at a very high level (97%)
 - The vast majority (92%) of residents see the improvement in the quality of life of Poles thanks to the use of European Funds (an increase of 8% compared to 2020)
 - As many as 80% of Mazovian residents see areas or projects supported by European funds in their immediate surroundings

(rowth of as much as 21% over 2020)

- More and more people (76%) believe that they personally benefit from European funds (15% increase over 2020)
- European funds are well used according to **74%** of residents
- As many as **78%** of residents recognize the European funds logo (**14%** increase over 2020)
- residents were most likely to come into contact with European funds logo on TV (35%), in the internet (33%), as well as on things related to European funds (22%)
- Almost one in four residents (24%) say they come across information about European funds often or very often

"Leader of Change" Competition

In 2022, a special edition of the Leader of Change competition was held, recognizing healthcare leaders with assistance from the European Union. The competition was organized under the honorary patronages of Marshal of the Mazowieckie Voivodeship and the European Commission Representation in Poland. **Forty-two beneficiaries** of the regional program for Mazovia 2014-2020 participated, and awards were given within 4 categories: Fighting the COVID-19 pandemic, Diagnosis and treatment of patients, Prevention and health programs, and Innovation. The best projects were chosen by residents during an online voting via www.liderzmian.eu website.

The awards ceremony was held as part of the 12th Mazovia Development Forum.
